General information: -

Brahmaputra Degree College is situated in Bakulguri, Dhakuakhana Sub-Division, under Lakhimpur district of Assam. It is in the southeren part of Dhakuakhana town and the north bank of Brahmaputra River which is one of the premier institutions of higher education in Assam. It is about 8 kms away from Dhakuakhana town. This renowned higher educational institution was established on 5^{th} August 1993 by the great efforts of the enthusiastic educated indigenous people of this vast area. Since its inception, the college has been catering to the academic needs of Assam in general and Dhakuakhana Sub-Division in Particular. The College has been offering U.G Programme in Arts Stream only. Environment of the College Campus is of charming nature, peaceful atmosphere and utmostly suitable for the student society. Most of the inhabitant of this area basically belong to ST, SC, OBC and MOBC communities. The whole area is socio-economically backward but culturally very rich. It is dwelt in by people of diverse castes, creeds, communities, tribes and ethnic groups who have their own distinct culture, religion and language. On the whole, since its inception, the college has been sincerely imparting higher education at U.G level and devoutety working for the all round of development of students and the communities of this area. The college was permanently affiliated to Dibrugarh University on 12th September 2007. The college obtained U.G.C's 2F and 12B from University Grant Commission on 6th August 2008 & 7th July 2013 respectively. The college was provincialised on 3rd June, 2014 under the provincialization Act namely Assam Venture Institution Provincialization Act. 2011 and amended as 2012 by Govt. of Assam (w.e.f. 14th August. 2013)

Rules for Internal Assessment in B.A. Programmes in CBCS:

The marks allotted for Internal Assessment (20%) in each course shall be based on thefollowing:

a) Sessional Examination I (Written): 25% of the marks allotted for internal assessment.

b) Sessional Examination II (Written): 25% of the marks allotted for internal assessment.

c) Seminar/ Group Discussion: 25% of the marks allotted for internal assessment.

d) Attendance: 25% of the marks allotted for internal assessment.

1. General English, 2. MIL includes Assamese, Hindi and Alternative English

3. Environmental studies.

(B) Core Subjects: -

A general course student can select maximum of two subjects as Core and a Major coursestudent can select only one subject as core from the following subject:

<u>Examination:</u>

Sessional, Terminal Test Examination's for Classes of students are to be held as mentioned in details in the Academic Calendar. Students must appear in all examinations and secure a minimum qualifying mark. Those students who are unable to fulfill this condition will not be allowed to appear in the final examination of the university. Date of final examination schedule will be notified by the University.

For the U.G Students under CBCS:-

1. Examination and evaluation shall be done on a continuous basis, at least three times duringeach Semester.

2. There shall be 20% marks for internal assessment and 80% marks for End-Semesterexamination in each course during every Semester.

3. Internal Assessment:-

(a) In internal assessment, different tools such as objective test, written test, assignments, paper presentation etc. suitable to the course may be employed.

(b) The students shall be informed in advance about the nature of assessment. Students shall be required to attend internal assessment compulsorily, including appearing for the Sessional Test.

4. End Semester Examination:

(a) There shall be one End Semester examination carrying 80% marks in each course of a semester covering the entire syllabus prescribed for the course. The End Semester examination is normally a Written/Project work/Dissertation.

(b) The controller of Examinations shall make necessary arrangements for notifying the dates of the End Semester Examinations and other procedures as per Dibrugarh University Rules (at least 20 days in advance and the academic calendar notified by the University.

Semester Duration:

Online Application for admission to B.A. CBCS 1^{st} Semester are invited usually in the month of June and July. In case of Bachelor of Arts (B.A), a student passed the H.S course or an equivalent examination (10+2) recognized as such by the University will be eligible. Candidates are to apply through online in prescribed form only. The applicant who is eligible for admission into B.A (CBCS) 1^{st} Semester Class must be accompanied by attested copies of the following –

1. Mark sheet, Certificate, and all other relevant documents will be scanned and uploaded at the time of filling up the form during online admission. Students have to upload Bank Details, A/C No. IFSC Code, Bank and Branch Name, Mobile No. while applying for application.

2. Copy of the H.S.L.C & H.S. Examination Passed Mark sheet and Certificate.

3. One copy of recent passport size photograph dully signed by the candidate.

4. H.S.L.C Admit card/Birth certificate as copy of the age proof certificate etc.

5. Certificate of co-curricular (Games & Sports Culture etc.) activities, physically challenges/ differently abled (in case of concerned reservation Quota).

6. Students having the gap period in case of the last qualifying examination passed before 2020 must submit a Gap period Certificate regarding the activities during the gap period with proper documents.

<u>Admission Procedure:-</u>

1. Those students who fulfill the essential qualification and have applied for admission only online in prescribed form with all testimonials and particulars are eligible for admission into the concerned discipline.

2. Admission will be strictly on merit basis.

Cancellation of Admission:

Admission of a student can be cancelled at any stage if it is found that he/she has furnished incorrect information or has suppressed fact to secure admission. If any dispute arises out of such referral/cancellation, the decision of the principal shall be final.

Student's Attendance:

All students must attend their classes. Attendance will be taken into account for the purpose of allowing students for appearing at the semester examination, election of the student's union, scholarships and academic awards etc. In every Semester each student is required to attend a minimum 80% of the classes held in each subject. Irregular students may be asked to leave the institution and his/her seat is liable to be forfeited.

Any change in the academic calendar/ Schedule may be made by the University whenevernecessary.

Registration:

The students who are admitted into B.A (CBCS) 1st Semester course have to be registered under Dibrugarh University Registration form. In this regard registration can be obtained from the Registration Branch of Brahmaputra Degree College and the students have to submit the registration form to the Registration Branch of the College within the stipulated period of time as fixed by the college authority.

College Uniform:

All students must enter the College premise in Uniform. The College uniform for the students is as follows-

- 1. For Boys: Navy Blue trouser with white shirt.
- 2. For Girls:- White Churidar with Navy Blue Dupatta.

Identity Card:-

An identity card will be issued to every student at the time of admission. The card contains vital information about the holder viz name, Semester, class, roll no., combination of subjects and a passport size photograph duly endorsed by the principal. This card is non-transferable. Every student is expected to carry the card with him/her at all times.

<u>Scholarships:</u>

- (a) National Scholarship.
- (b) Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe/OBC/MOBC Scholarship, as per State Government rules.

(c) 'Ishan Uday', a UGC scholarship for North-East students.

Note:

I) Students are required to maintain strict discipline and show regular attendance failingwhich their scholarship may be withdrawn.

II) Information regarding scheme of national and state scholarships are available in theinternet.

Facilities:-

Library: The college library has a collection of about 3.100 (three thousand one hundred) copies of text books and reference books, Furthermore many useful journals, Magazines and Newspapers are provided to the students. Every student will be issued two library cards against which he/she can borrow books one against each card.

<u>Gymnasium:</u>

The college has a Multipurpose Gymnasium with all kinds of gym facilities for students and staff. It is equipped with treadmills, exercise benches, weight training apparatus etc.

Xerox Machine:-

The college has one Xerox machine. The student can copy any kind of study material at concessional rate.

Games & Sports:

The college has adequate facilities for games and sports such as a big playground with a gallery and Multipurpose Gymnasium Hall. There are Badminton courts, Carom Board Sets, Chess Boards etc.

College Canteen:-

There is a canteen in the college campus for refreshment. It provides food items to all stakeholders including students, staffs and others in the college.

Drinking Water Facility:-

The college has drinking water facilities in the campus. Adequate facilities have been provided to supply pure drinking water for both students and staff.

College Magazine:

The College has an annual magazine with is a platform for the students to develop their literary ambition and personalities. It publishes articles and creative writings contributed by students and teachers.

Boys' and Girls' Common Room:-

Separate Boys' and Girls' Common room facilities are provided to the students for recreational activities during their leisure periods.

Hostel Facilities:-

There is a Girls hostel in the college campus. The two storied Girls' hostel has 45 seat capacities. Hostel provides good facility for the girls. Separate application form for admission to the hostel is made with guardian's acknowledgement. Admission to the hostel will be strictly on merit basis. Hostel is governed by the college rules.

Various Cells/ Committees Career Counseling Cell:-

The college has a Career guidance cell to help the students in choosing the right path or track for their career advancement. The aims and objectives of the cell are-

1. To create awareness about self-employment and entrepreneurship as a career option among the students.

2. To provide information regarding careers in different directions.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IOAC):

Brahmaputra Degree College has Internal Quality Assurance Cell which is constituted by members from GB and teaching staff, Students representative with Principal as its chairman. The regular affairs of the cell are looked after by one co-ordinator from teaching staff.

Academic Council:-

The Academic council of the College is constituted with all the head of the departments and a senior teacher is appointed as the Secretary of the council. It looks after the entire academic affairs of the College.

Grievance Redressal Cell:-

The Grievance Redressal Cell of the College is maintained by a Committee comprising of teaching and non-teaching staff and students. A complain box is placed at a convenient place to lodge grievances/ opinion and suggesions is writing.

Women Cell:-

The college has the Women Cell which is constituted with lady teachers and girl students. The Cell looks after the problems and prospects of Women. <u>Research</u>

Cell:-

The College has the research cell which encourages and approves the research cultureamong the faculties as well as the other researcher from various colleges of the country.

Discipline Committee:-

The function of the committee is to look after the discipline of college to adopt the measures to prevent indiscipline, to improve discipline in the college and to maintain always a good environment.

Anti-Ragging Committee:-

The functions of the Anti-Ragging committee are to adopt all necessary policies and steps to prevent ragging in the college and also to take action if and when required in the case of ragging.

<u>NSS:-</u>

The College has National Service Scheme Unit (NSS) which has been doing Service since 2017.

- I) NSS activities include community service through various awareness camps like healthcamp, blood donation camp, adoption of Model Village, activities related to environment protection and plantation, disaster management, village sanitation, literacy programme and all such works that contribute to community development.
- *II)* NSS Volunteers are eligible for Indira Gandhi National Award for outstanding service to community development.
- *II)* There are quotas of reservation for NSS Volunteers in all India universities for admission in different course.

Students Union:-

There is a student's union in the college. The union Body is formed of class representatives elected from each class as per the college constitution. The student union Body consists of the following 14 portfolios-

President, Vice President, General Secy, Asst. G.Secy, Social Service Secy, Major Games Secy. Minor Games Secy, Cultural Secy. Gymnasium Secy, Magazine Secy, Debating Secy, Literature Secy, Boys' Common Room Secy, Girls' Common Room Secy.

General Rules for maintenance discipline among the Students:-

The following activities of the students in the college will be considered as serious offence. All powers for maintaining discipline are vested with the Principal and the disciplinary action committee and their decision shall be final in all such matters.

1. 80% class attendance is mandatory to appear in any final Examination.

2. Pleasant and cordial atmosphere should be maintained during college's hours.

3. Gossiping and loitering in college campus or in college verandahs or in the class room arestrictly prohibited.

4. Mobile phone is strictly prohibited in the class room and examination hall.

5. Use of unfair means in college examinations are strictly prohibited.

6. Damaging, defacing or devaluing any college property.

7. Disobedience to college authority and teachers.

8. Uniform with Logo is compulsory for all students.

9. Intoxicant including Pan Masala, gutkha, Smoking and Spitting in the class room are strictly prohibited.

10. Postering or writing on the walls or blackboard of the college is strictly prohibited.

11. Irregularities, Misbehaviour, Violence of any kind and disobedience towards the teachers or authority by any students are punishable.

12. Regularity and Punctuality in attending classes must be maintained.


